Gender Equality Clothesline Project

Community houses promoting action on gender equality

The Gender Equality Clothesline Project aims to be a coordinated community campaign across all Outer Eastern Region community houses which encourages people to take action on gender equality.

As part of this campaign all community houses across the cities of Knox, Maroondah and Yarra Ranges are invited to become part of the Gender Equality Clothesline Project by running a GE Clothesline Project activity in the first 2 weeks of August and participating in co-ordinated displays and promotions during the 16 Days of Activism in November.

Participating houses will all be eligible to receive up to \$1,000 to support their participation and to help for example in freeing up community house staff time to attend a workshop and run an activity at the centre.

Led by a partnership of the Community House Association for the Outer Eastern Suburbs (CHAOS), EACH, Eastern Domestic Violence Service (EDVOS), Women's Health East Maroondah, Knox and Yarra Ranges Councils, the project aims to contribute to the regional work on preventing violence against women.
